## **Small Scripture Study For Men**

You are invited to join small scripture study groups based on the Church's tradition called Lectio Divina. Lectio Divina, or Divine Reading, is an ancient monastic practice that Pope Benedict XVI has recommended to all lay Catholics as a way to hear God and respond to Him with openness of heart. Following this tradition, the study groups examine the context of the following Sunday Gospel reading and spend time in guided reflection and discussion points that lead to a weekly personal resolution. Our goal is a deeper understanding of God's Word, a deeper prayer life, and growth in virtue. We have kept the study to an hour. An ideal group is made of 4 to 7 people, and is easy to facilitate. We have two men's groups established and have an open invitation for additional participants or study groups based on personal availability.
