Mass of Installation

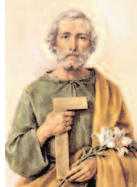

Dear parishioners and friends,

Usually when a new pastor arrives in a parish, many parishioners begin to wonder what his "vision" is for the parish. Over the past week, I have been praying about how to express my vision. Of course, the vision should not be mine alone, but that of Christ the Lord, but it is up to me to collaborate with you to fulfill the Lord's desire for the parish. While reading this week, I stumbled upon this quote Pope John Paul II that perfectly expresses my vision, and hopefully the vision of all pastors, "Your first duty as pastors is not projects and organizations but to lead your people to a deep intimacy with the Trinity."

I know that we have a very busy parish where the parishioners are very involved. This is such a wonderful thing, and I plan to continue supporting all of the great work done in the parish and Newman Center. I also have new ideas for ways we can grow in knowledge and love of our Catholic Faith! Yet, all of these endeavors mean nothing if they are not founded in and flow from an authentic life of prayer. It is in prayer we encounter the Triune God.

So, God willing, my primary focus as your pastor will be to help you grow in knowledge and love of the Trinity through a deeper prayer life. This will be done primarily through the Liturgy – which is the most perfect form of prayer and the way we come into the most intimate contact with the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

Notice the Pope does not say "intimacy with God" but with the Trinity. So often in our spiritual lives we focus only on God as some amorphous entity. Yet, God has revealed himself as three persons – Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, and we are called to intimacy with each person in their unity as God. This is surely a profound mystery – one that I certainly do not grasp fully. Be assured that I will do my best to remain faithful to my personal prayer and to be open to the guidance of the Spirit. I ask you to keep me in your prayers so that I might be faithful in guiding you deeper into that Trinitarian intimacy!

NEW VESTMENTS – Since I've arrived, several people have asked me if



there was anything they could help with or provide for the parish. After looking over things and thinking about it, I realized that we are in need of new vestments for Mass. We only have a few that belong to the parish, and most of those are a bit worn, some are missing stoles, or they are "Fr. Chester-sized." This is a great opportunity for parishioners to help the parish, to something in memory of a loved one, and to add beauty to the liturgy with vestments that better complement the

beauty of our church. We are asking for a \$600 or \$300 donation which will cover the whole or half cost of each vestment set and because there will only be room for two names to be sewn into the vestment. Each vestment can be donated in memory of a loved one or family member and a "Donated in memory of..." tag will be sewn into the vestment. The vestments will be hand made by House of Hansen out of Chicago. I have worked with them for over ten years, and they do wonderful work. We will order as many vestments as people and families are willing to donate. Thank you in advance for your generosity to the parish!
